PAFC – Power to End Violence against Women Program

Golden Grove High School was recently accredited as a White Ribbon school and over the last two weeks the Port Adelaide Football Club have been working with a group of Year 10 students on this very important issue of domestic violence.

The program began by discussing some current statistics and trends around violence against women and we were all shocked to hear that almost every week a woman will die in Australia at the hands of a partner or ex-partner. In addition to this, one in four women has experienced emotional abuse by their partner.

These are quite confronting statistics, but it's vital that we have these conversations, and with young men, so that we can address the issue and make it socially and morally unacceptable for domestic violence to continue in any form.

Over the two sessions we were visited by a team of people from the PAFC, including Russell and Brett Ebert. Our students engaged well with the presenters and the class discussion showed that everyone took something out of the program and that we are all committed to take a stand against domestic violence.
